

CITY OF FLORIDA CITY HURRICANE UPDATES

MAYOR OTIS T. WALLACE DECLARES STATE OF EMERGENCY AS HURRICANE MILTON INTENSIFIES: IMPORTANT PREPARATIONS AND ADVISORY

The City of Florida City has declared a State of Emergency as Hurricane Milton intensifies into a Category 4 hurricane. This declaration is a follow up to similar actions by the State of Florida and Miami-Dade County. In response, the city's Public Works and Water departments are actively pumping water from flooded areas and clearing drains as part of standard hurricane preparation. Florida City has initiated stormhardening measures and the Florida City Police are patrolling the streets to ensure community safety. The City continues to closely monitor the storm and is taking all necessary steps to protect the residents and infrastructure.

Important Advisory for Residents:

- Sandbag Distribution: A sandbag distribution will take place for Florida City residents on Monday, October 7th from 11:00 AM-3:00PM and Tuesday, October 8th, from 9:00 AM-1:00 PM. Residents MUST provide a photo I.D. or a utility bill. There will be a limit of 5 sandbags per vehicle.

- The distribution will take place at the following location: Florida City Public Works Compound-428 SW 2nd Avenue, Florida City, FL 33034
- Solid Waste: Solid waste collection is scheduled as normal. Please stay tuned for updates.
- Park Facility Hours: No changes to operating hours have been announced. Please stay tuned for updates.
- Construction and Business Site Safety: Secure all materials and equipment to prevent debris from becoming projectiles.
- Stay away from Downed Wires & Report Power Outages: Treat all downed power lines as live and extremely dangerous. Report downed wire and outages to Florida Power & Light at:1-800-468-8243- 1-800-4OUTAGE
- Residents dependent on electric-powered, life-sustaining medical equipment should finalize their family emergency plan for backup power.

Resident Safety Tips:

- Fill up Gas Tanks: Ensure your vehicle is fully fueled in case of power outages or evacuation orders.
- Charge all Electronics: Fully charge phones, tablets, and portable chargers in case of power loss.
- Avoid Tree Trimming or Bulk Trash Disposal: High winds can turn debris into dangerous projectiles.
- Stock up on Essential Supplies: Prepare at least three days' worth of food, water and medicine. A minimum of one gallon of water per person per day is recommended.
- Secure your Home: Reinforce windows, secure loose outdoor items and bring pets inside.
- Prepare an Emergency Kit: Include flashlights, batteries, first-aid supplies, important documents and cash.

- Stay Indoors During the Storm: Avoid driving or going
- outside until authorities confirm it is safe.
- Stay Informed: Follow local weather reports and official City updates for the latest information.
